### HIPGive

Hispanics in Philanthropy (HIP) is a non-profit organization that helps connect donors with causes that support the Latinx community. Through the digital [HIPGive portal](#), donors can launch their own fundraising campaigns, give to an existing project, or support a growing list of charities.

### LaunchGood

[LaunchGood](#) is the world's largest Muslim crowdfunding platform with nearly one million users worldwide, and an official GivingTuesday partner. The platform supports giving circles, community fundraising campaigns, and competitions to raise the most for a selected cause.

### Philanthropy Together

Founded in New York City, [SAGE USA](#) is the nation's largest and longest-operating organization serving elderly LGBTQ+ populations. Beyond donations, the organization is always looking for new volunteers, community organizers, and corporate partners.
