Pop-up Speakeasy

Famed cocktail bar <u>Please Don't Tell</u>, also known as PDT, alongside sister restaurant <u>Crif Dogs</u>, is hosting a <u>popup bar</u> on the 86th floor of the Empire State Building until May 30. If you can't make it to the pop-up, don't worry – on a typical business day, PDT's entrance is a phone booth inside Crif Dogs' Lower East Side outpost.
